Behavior and Environmental Stimulation

As both the cold weather and holidays arrive, it's important to pay extra attention to our pets who can get lost in the shuffle. Less exercise and more time alone is never a good combination and it can lead to unwanted behaviors. Some pets experience separation anxiety and this can lead to melancholy, property destruction and regressive toileting accidents, all of which are undesirable for both you and your pet.

Does your dog eat too fast? Here are two possible solutions you can try.

- Food maze: This one is great for the chow-hounds out there that inhale meals in practically one gulp, sometimes causing regurgitation ("spitting up") of foot immediately afterward. The maze slows eating and keeps the brain active for a longer period of time.
- Food puzzle: As the pet paws at one of the tubes, it will swing and drop pieces of food. This activity is an excellent choice for the highly active, highly intelligent dog. It is a simple DIY project, or you can find a manufactured version selling online. For an excellent example on YouTube, search for "Bella's Bottle Game".
- Medications and Behavior Specialist consultation: If environmental modification alone is unsuccessful and the pet remains highly anxious and/or a danger to itself/others, please seek assistance from your veterinarian or a veterinary Behavior Specialist immediately (https://www.dacvb.org).
